

### Connect Lake County

Many of our members at YCC experience challenges with digital equity – lacking access to technology that enables them to work, learn, and contribute to the community via online resources. Through our partnership with ConnectLakeCounty, we are addressing this need and providing training and tools for our members to bridge the digital divide. A ConnectLakeCounty facilitator has been with YCC members on a weekly basis for digital training. At the end of the 7-week program, members who complete the training will be provided with a laptop computer to take home, free of charge.

Thanks to our friends at DK Organics, our 27 raised garden beds are well-nourished and ready to grow. DK Organics provided two truckloads of mulch so the food crops that members have planted will thrive this year! Our garden beds will yield tomatoes, zucchini, corn, and much more, which will be offered free of charge to our neighbors around our Waukegan facility.
